EDITORIAL..... by John Kellas



RPA STAMP DESIGN CONTEST

This contest is open to all RPA members. The subject of the proposed stamp must fit into the 'Americana Series' theme. The USPS has announced that seven regular 'Americana' issues are planned for earily 1979. The new issues will be a 30%. 50%, \$1.00, and \$5.00. The designs of all but the 30%issue will feature lighting devices similar to the \$2.00 stamp being issued November 16. Also there will be a \$3.00 stamp booklet for over-thecounter sales which may use the 'Americana' theme. YOUR design must be in scale to the present Americana series stamp size. It can be just a design with or without the characteristic phase along two sides of the stamp border. The contest dead-line will be the December RPA neeting and the proposed stamps will be featured in the "H & T" Jan. '79 issue All ideas will be sent to the Citizen's Stamp Advisory Committee and the winner may actually become a US stamp issue in '79 with FDC in Rochester!

USPS TO DEMONTIZEPOSTAL ITEMS.....

With few public announcements, the USPS will be effectively demonetizing more than 100 postal items after NOV.30; the date set monetizing more than 100 postal items after NOV.30; the date set for new MINIMUM size standards to take effect. The new standard tern as "non-mailable" any item which is \(\frac{1}{4}\)" thick or less and less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ " high, 5" long and .007" thick. What this means is that the vast majority of postal cards issued through 1976 will become non-mailable. (most postal cards were $3\frac{1}{4}$ " high or less) The USPS Manual does provide for refunds when such items are presented, but at only 85% of face value(section 147.13). Thus collectors and the general mublic may be "stuck" with unusable postal items or face a 15% loss public may be "stuck" with unusable postal items or face a 15% loss of value if redeemed by the USPS. All US postal cards issue before 1977 will be demonetized except: (scott#s) UX10,UX12, UX13,UX59, UX61-63,UX67; UY1,UY2,UY11,12; UXC11,UXC12-13,UXC15,16. These are the only US postal cards, among all those issued prior to 1977, that will still be usable after Nov. 30. A few embossed item will ilso be affected by the MINIMUM size standards.
