We all know about the city we live in, Rochester, NY.

But what do you know about other places named Rochester?

Here's a brief tour of "other" Rochester villages, towns and cities near and far that you may (or may not) have heard of before.

The derivation of the name "Rochester" refers to a "fortified bridge." The City of Rochester in Great Britain was called "Hrofoecoestra" as found in <u>The Veneable Bede</u> (circa 730 AD). It is a combination of the old English word "hrof" meaning roof or bridge, and the Latin word "castra" meaning a fortified military camp.

ROCHESTER, NY (Monroe County)

Founded in 1788.

Population: 210,000


Post Office Opened: 1812-1821 (Genesee County), 1821-Date (Monroe County)


Rochester was first known as "the Young Lion of the West", and then as the "Flour City". By 1838, Rochester was the largest flour-producing city in the United States. Having doubled its population in only 10 years, Rochester became America's first "boomtown".



ROCHESTER, NY (Ulster County)


Founded in 1703.

Population: 7,238

Post Office Opened: 1820-1826

Mombaccus was the Dutch name for the area that became the Town of Rochester. It was first settled in 1672. The name Rochester began with the issuance of a land patent in 1703. It became a Town in 1788 and the formal establishment of the Town of Rochester occurred in 1803.







Rochester is the southeastern end of the Lost Bridge Trail, a 5.0-mile (8.0 km) trail built by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) atop an abandoned rail bed formerly used by the Baltimore and Ohio (B&O) railroad.



Founded in 1835.


Population: 6,021

Rochester was laid out in 1835. The founder Alexander Chamberlain named it for his former hometown of Rochester, New York. Known as "The Round Barn Capital of the World", Rochester is the county seat of Fulton County.

Rochester was named after Rochester, New York, known for its flour mills, due to its location on the Cedar River.

ROCHESTER, KS (Neosho and Kingman County)


Founded in mid-1880s.

The town moved in 1887 and renamed New Rochester, when there were 28 other places named Rochester in the country. Later renamed Zenda after the novel THE PRISONER OF ZENDA.





Rochester was named to honor the family of John Rochester.


















Founded in 1679.





Population: 13,017


Post Office Opened: 1827-Date

The first settlers in what would become Rochester, the Graham family, built a log cabin in 1817. The city was named for Rochester, New York, just like Rochester, Minnesota, as many early settlers to the area were formerly from the state of New York.

ROCHESTER, MN (Olmstead County)

Founded in 1854.



The area initially developed as a stagecoach stop between Saint Paul and Dubuque, Iowa. The community was named after Rochester, New York by emigrants from that area. It is the home of the Mayo Clinic and one of IBM's largest facilities.

ROCHESTER, MO (Andrew County)



The town was one of four granted by Colonial Governor Samuel Shute of Massachusetts and New Hampshire during his brief term. It was named for his close friend, Laurence Hyde, Earl of Rochester and brother-in-law to King James II.

Rochester was founded in 1852 by Samuel James. Robert Paton, who opened the first market in 1889, opened the first lumber mill in the early 1880s. Rochester, Washington was named after Rochester, Michigan.

Originally called Ideal Flats, renamed Rochester in 1912 when rail service from Edmonton to Athabasca was completed, for Herbert Rochester who was secretary to the General Manager of the Canadian National Railway from 1909-15.

Population: 27,000


Post Office Opened: unknown

Rochester was recognized as a City from 1211 to 1998. The City of Rochester's ancient status was unique, as it had no formal council or Charter Trustees nor a Mayor, instead having the office of Admiral of the River Medway, whose incumbent acted as de facto civic leader.


