Withdrawn Stamps of the 21st Century


From time to time postal administrations uncover a reason to withdraw a stamp due to a design error or controversy of what is depicted. Most interesting to collectors are those that have already been printed and, in many cases, put on sale to the public in the normal course of business or by mistake.

Once identified, the issuing administration has several options:

- Recall all remaining stamps and destroy or modify them, possibly creating philatelic rarities of those already sold
- Leave them on sale, with or without opting to print and release a corrected version days, weeks or years later

Two such recalls and their reissues made big news in the 1990s.

1993 USA- Legends of the West



Wrong "Bill Pickett" image printed, error discovered before release and recalled, but 183 sheets were sold before the issue date. USPS held a lottery with 150,000 error sheets sold. The sheet of 20 was reissued in 1994 with the corrected image.

1996 New Zealand- Health Semi-Postals



Child and teddy positioned wrong, as NZ law required seat to be facing to the rear of the car, not forward. Water activated and self-stick stamps recalled and supposedly destroyed before release, with non-teddy revisions printed. But two post offices inadvertently retained the older versions, selling a few hundred of them. The self-sticks are the rarer of the two formats.

It was hoped that the twenty-first century would usher in an era of far fewer such withdrawn (or recalled) stamps, but just the opposite is happening. This presentation shows just a small sampling of those issued from 2000 through 2023!

Supply and demand dictate the value of a withdrawn issue. Prices here are from offerings on ebay, Delcampe and HipStamp. The numbers released is a factor, as is the subject matter. Those from lesser popular collecting countries may not demand the premium of a more popular one. Nations notorious for poor quality control of their stamp issues are also less desirable.



Liberia issued a set of stamps and souvenir sheets Oct. 2 for every US president ahead of the US November election. Prepared in advance were similar items for both candidates with only the winner's items to be released, wanting to be the first to honor him. In the election result confusion, they released everything, withdrawing Gore items knowing the final outcome.




The Laos "People's Democratic Republic" (Laos <u>PD</u>R) had the letters D and R mixed up (Laos <u>PR</u>D) on the original release on this "Year of the Mountain" set that were withdrawn. A corrected version was later released.



Withdrawn on March 31, 47 days after being issued, this stamp was one of a set of three honoring famous Hungarians meant to depict botanist Rezső Soó. However the stamp shows another Hungarian botanist, Ujvárosi Miklós.

Greece

Greek 2004 Olympic medalists were honored on a stamp the next day, including 62 kilo weight class bronze winner weightlifter Leonidas Sampanis. He failed two drug tests days later and was stripped of his medal on August 22 by the IOC. ELTA, the Greek Post, ordered all post offices to stop selling his stamps and return all those remaining.

Officially released under the title "Successful Establishment of Human Cloned Embryonic Stem Cells," this stamp honored the scientific breakthrough by scientist Hwang Woo-suk. By January 2006 enough evidence was collected to prove the data was falsified and the stamp was withdrawn later that month.






The Sikh sacred text, the Guru Granth Sahib, celebrated its 400th anniversary in 2004, commemorated here. The religion forbids imagery of the book, which is also lacking its "rumala" cloth covering on the stamp. These were distributed to post offices and recalled before issuing, however some leaked out.



October 27, 2005

An earthquake hit the Kashmir region of Pakistan on October 8 and this sheet was released as a fund raiser. Intended that all Rs 100 go to the fund, the law required the face value of Rs 32 go to the Post. It was withdrawn over the controversy.



A set of 5 depicting native Maori "Kapa Haka" performing arts was to be issued in New Zealand but were deemed too cartoonish by the public. NZ Post decided to recall all the stamps June 2, five days before the release date, back from post offices. Eight advance orders had already been mailed out and paid for by customers, creating rarities.

Dr. Yunus was honored for winning the Nobel Peace Prize for pioneering the concepts of microcredit and microfinance. The original stamp was withdrawn Sept. 2, as the wrong Nobel medal is shown, his first name was wrongly abbreviated and "Peace" was omitted.

Mauritius image and text errors

The 50th Anniversary of the Ministerial System was commemorated here, but had several errors. The lower right image is not that of A.M. Osman but his brother, A. H. Osman. Incorrect captions include "Dr. G. Millien" instead of "Dr. E. Millien", and "R. Vaghjee" instead of "H.R. Vaghjee". The stamp was withdrawn and reissued, but without the two text names being corrected.


Caught before its scheduled release, this Russian stamp depicts scenes from St. Petersburg, including the famous Samson Fountain in Peterhof Palace. However the stamp bore the city's former name by mistake, Leningrad. While none reached post offices, some were sold through the state philatelic agency.



Malaysia's "Unique Birds of Malaysia" set of stamps included a souvenir sheet. While on the selvage, the country's name was missing from the stamp itself. Withdrawn after a few days, it was reissued with the name and the logo of a Chinese stamp show.

Issued as part of a set featuring "Philippine Biodiversity" the 5 peso stamp accurately depicts a "cyerce nigricans," but was incorrectly labeled as a sea hare and quickly withdrawn. A replacement was issued six months later.



The seventh edition of Japan's Hometown Scenes sheet series had a map of Hokkaido in the upper right corner showing the controversial South Kurils Islands as well, disputed land with Russia. The sheet was withdrawn the next day to avoid a political clash with its neighbor.

Two definitives featuring Queen Margarethe II did not meet quality standards after being made and were withdrawn on May 26. It was found that the printing plate used suffered from inconsistent steel engravings. Replacements of a new design were released 19 months later in differing colors.

Celebrating the Buddhist Vesak festival, four holy sites are shown within a map of India. However one of them shows the Maya Devi Temple in Buddha's birthplace, Lumbini, Nepal. Nepalese political and religious groups protested and the stamp and souvenir sheet were withdrawn.

A miniature sheet of 9 stamps with a vignette at the top left honoring Ivica Kostelić was withdrawn two days later under protest of the Croatian Ski Federation, as the label was missing the sponsor's logo, Raiffeisen Grupa. (200,000 sheets printed)



Withdrawn on the day of issue, this stamp honors poet Ivo Andrić on the 50th anniversary of winning the Nobel Prize for Literature. Despite bearing "Поште Српске" (Serbian Post), it was missing the actual name of the country. Supposedly between 400-2,951 were sold out of the print run of 15,000. A new version was issued ten weeks later, with "Босна и Херцеговина - Република Српска" (Bosnia Herzegovina – Republic Srpska).

On its acceptance into the European Union Macedonia released a set of two stamps featuring capitols of two nations, Cyprus and Denmark. However, the country's name was spelled incorrectly as МАКДОНИЈА (missing an "E") instead of МАКЕДОНИЈА. The set was withdrawn and reissued on the same day a year later.



Egypt's original intent to depict scenes from the recently widened Suez Canal project, costing £2.4 billion, mistakenly showed views of the Panama Canal instead. According to the online edition of Cairo Post, Egypt's postal authority ordered sales of the error stamps ended on Saturday, September 13. The revised version added "The New Suez Canal" in English.

The Travnik fortress was built around the turn of the 15th century, but its minaret was added later under the Ottomans after 1463. The original release omits the minaret, which still stands today.

North Macedonia

A set of two stamps were issued by Macedonia to mark its presidency of the European Union, each in a sheetlet of 8 stamps and central label. The Zagreb stamp was withdrawn the next day due to protests by its neighbors Bosnia, Serbia and Montenegro as it showed a map of what was "Greater Croatia" during World War II instead of its border of today. The set had a print run of 6,000 stamps.



Valeriu Gafencu (1921-1952), died at the age of 31 after spending 11 years in a Romanian communist prison for his Christian beliefs. This stamp notes his 100th birth year, but was lacking the country's name and recalled on April 21. A new version was issued later on June 6.




Good intentions went awry with this "Racial Equality" set issued on the one year anniversary of the George Floyd murder. The four stamps vary in face value based on skin tone, with darkest skin having the least value: pale 1.60€, slightly darker 1.50€, brown 0.80€, and black 0.70€. Their release was to 'reflect an unfair and painful reality that shouldn't be allowed'. They were withdrawn on May 28 after worldwide condemnation.







World Youth Day was celebrated with this Vatican stamp for only three days before it was withdrawn. The Pope is shown leading children around Lisbon, Portugal's famous Henry the Navigator statue. Opposition came from those who believe it was procolonialism and others who thought it gave tacit approval to the country's dictator at the time it was built, Antonio Salazar.
