Pitcairn Islands First Definitive Series Postal History

This exhibit addresses the rates, routes and usages associated with the KGVI definitive series. The first eight values were issued October 15, 1940. The 4d. and 8d. values were added to the series on September 1, 1951. The series was replaced by the first QEII definitives on July 2, 1957.
