Many of the recent United States airmail rates are still archived on the U.S. Postal Service's web site. The author has also used the Postal Bulletin, a USPS publication, for information about each of the new stamps.

The Scenic American Landscapes series continues today. With annual rate increases likely, new airmail stamps in this series will continue.

Two new stamps are being issued May 16,2008: a 72¢ 13-Mile Woods stamp and a 94¢ St. John U.S. Virgin Islands stamp.

Both of these stamps will only add some further interest to the hunt for new uses in this interesting and expanding series of airmail stamps.
