Australia unclaimed; England removed from the mails, re-mailed to Belgium Destinations: Persia; Apia Samoa; Transvaal; Cape of Good Hope non UPU
Forwarded : To Ceylon via Burma; to Brazil from London via B F Stevens agents Kerguelen Islands located in Indian Ocean above Antarctica; Shanghai China Supplementary mail 2 hours before sailing: 10 minutes before sailing
