SYNOPSIS

NOVA SCOTIA 1851 – 1863: THE PRELIMINARIES

This exhibit traces the pre-production process, from concept to the Postal Authority's approval and the Lieutenant Governor's endorsement.

The philatelic elements showing the various pre-production stages are:

Die Essays: PENCE and CENTS
Composite Die Essay
Progressive Die Proof
Die Proofs unhardened state
Die Proofs hardened state
Trial Colour Die Proofs
Bank Note Co.'s Trade Proofs: both recorded values, in 6 colours
Engraved Perforated Proofs: both known values
Plate Proofs in issued & unissued colours
Plate Proofs with SPECIMEN overprints, all 4 recorded types included

The Colony of Nova Scotia issued a total of ten stamps; four PENCE and six CENTS values.

Seven stamps are based on portraits/vignettes of the young Queen Victoria, predicated on the works of three famous artists.

In this exhibit, as well, are shown the proofs' superior quality of clear impression on high-quality papers, as compared to production stamps.

The showing of some mint and used stamps is meant to emphasize contrast between proofs and production stamps.
