## U.S. domestic rates for first class surface postal and post cards between 1873 and today

Postal cards are cards produced by the government on which postage is prepaid. Post cards are cards produced by private companies and the postage is not prepaid. Postal cards and post cards offered a less expensive way for people and companies to send messages to each other. The issue with postal and post cards is privacy because anybody can read the message on the back of the card. This exhibit will show examples of all of the domestic first class surface postal and post card rates from 1873 when the rate became available to the current day rate of 28 cents. Except for the rate from July 1st, 1898 to November 1st, 1917 (which is the first time both types of cards had the same rate), only one type of example card is shown.
