INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES FOR PRESENTING ATA AWARDS

THE ATA DEFINITION OF TOPICALS

A topical/thematic exhibit is a grouping of postal material and documents, selected and arranged for subject of design or theme suggested, rather than for country of issuance or type of postal service rendered.

MULTI-FRAME EXHIBITS

CERTIFICATE: Best topical exhibit in a philatelic exhibition with less than 500 pages in competition.

FIRST AWARD: Best topical exhibit in a philatelic exhibition with more than 500 pages in competition. Winner must have received at least a show Bronze.

SECOND and THIRD AWARDS: For second and third best topical exhibits (if show committee has purchased the awards).

JUDGING BASIS

PRESENTATION: 10 points	PHILATELIC ELEMENTS:
TOPICAL/THEMATIC KNOWLEDGE:	Condition 10 points
Originality 5 points	Philatelic Items 10 points
Development of Theme 15 points	Scarcity and Rarity 15 points
Topical Research 25 points	Philatelic Information 10 points

ONE-FRAME EXHIBITS

MERIT AWARD RIBBON: For best topical exhibit.

YOUTH EXHIBITS

YOUTH AWARD: Best youth topical exhibit. Regional or National shows must have 3 or more youth exhibitors (not exhibits). Local or All-Youth shows must have 5 or more youth exhibitors.

NOTE: Only one ATA award can be given to an exhibit in the show.

Awards are not available for Display Class exhibits.
