Identification and Use of United Kingdom One Penny (1d) Perfins 1868-1880

SYNOPSIS

Purpose of Exhibit:

To show the Alphabetical distribution of Perfins which occurred on Penny Reds; supplemented with covers showing some of the stamp usage from the period of 1868 to 1880.

What is Presented:

Traditional exhibit of stamps with covers showing usage and detailed information on each Penny Red Perfin design.

This exhibit shows approximately 50% of the 1253 different Penny Red Perfins. Included here are 11 Perfin stamps that are the only known examples, an additional 17 are one of only two known, and 9 Perfins of only 39 known on plate 225. The selected Perfins represent a cross-section to demonstrate the variety and the distribution of Perfin usage throughout the United Kingdom. Also included are scarce covers blocks and multiple stamps. Details of each die include:

- 1 Date of use
- 2 Pin configuration
- 3 User of die and address
- 4 Business of user
