Regular Issues of the American Bank Note Company 1879-1893

Exhibit Scope

The following exhibit illustrates the regular issue stamps produced by the American Bank Note Company from 1879-1893. The exhibit starts with the stamps after the American Bank Note Company took over from the Continental Bank Note Company in 1879, and concludes with the "Baby Bank Note" issues of 1890-1893. The American Bank Note Company stamps may be distinguished by the fact that they were printed on soft porous paper. This period, 1879-1893, is marked by many significant historical and philatelic events. Several rate changes occurred, as well as issuance of a stamp to memorialize the slain President Garfield. In addition, the American Bank Note Company was the last private company to print regular issue stamps for some time, because the Bureau of Engraving and Printing took over in 1894 and continued until 1965. Essays, plate proofs, color variations, fancy cancellations, multiples, plate flaws, and usage on cover are depicted.
