## THE FARLEY ISSUES OF 1935

DURING 1934, POSTMASTER JAMES FARLEY, A CLOSE FRIEND OF PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT, ISSUED SEVERAL SOUVENIR TYPE STAMPS FOR THE BENEFIT OF STAMP COLLECTORS. AMONG THESE WERE SOUVENIR SHEETS OF 25 STAMPS FOR THE CHICAGO EXPOSITION, PANES OF 6 STAMPS FOR PHILATELIC EXPOSITIONS, AND A PANE OF 6 STAMPS FOR THE NEW YORK PHILATELIC EXPOSITION. THESE WERE ALL SOUVENIR SHEETS REPRODUCING STAMPS ISSUED PREVIOUSLY. ALSO ISSUED FOR GENERAL USE WAS A SET OF STAMPS DEPICTING TEN OF OUR NATIONAL PARKS.

POSTMASTER FARLEY THEN RELEASED <u>FULL</u>
<u>SHEETS</u> OF THESE AND SEVERAL OTHER 1934
COMMEMORATIVES AS FAVORS FOR "CERTAIN
FRIENDS." THESE RE-ISSUES WERE IDENTICAL TO
THE STAMPS AND SOUVENIR PANES EXCEPT THEY
WERE <u>NOT CUT INTO INDIVIDUAL PANES</u> AND <u>HAD NO</u>
<u>GUM</u> SINCE THEY WERE NOT INTENDED TO BE USED
FOR POSTAGE.

AS COULD BE EXPECTED, THE PHILATELIC PUBLIC FOUND OUT ABOUT THIS AND THE <u>OUTCRY</u> CAUSED THE POSTOFFICE TO <u>RE-ISSUE</u> THE SHEETS FOR STAMP COLLECTORS. THESE WERE ALL RELEASED ON MARCH 15, 1935 AND WERE AVAILABLE UNTIL JUNE 15.

MOST OF THESE SHEETS WERE THEN CUT INTO PANES AND SINGLES; LINE PAIRS AND GUTTER PAIRS; BLOCKS OF SEVERAL CONFIGURATIONS, INCLUDING CENTER LINE AND GUTTER BLOCKS; AND PLATE NUMBER BLOCKS; MANY OF WHICH ARE INCLUDED IN THIS EXHIBIT.
