

What Is Pokemon?

Have you ever come home and the first thing you heard was “All right! I just caught a...” What the heck is your child talking about? Well, you are in luck! This display class exhibit will teach you (the adults) the basics of these things called Pokemon; which is played with cards, Game Boys, and more. After looking at the various materials and reading the descriptions you will become familiar with a few Pokemon that they might want to tell you about. You will also find in the upper right hand corner a list of pokemon types. The first list describes ether their attacks are mainly physical or non-physical; then, what other types of Pokemon have a fighting advantage or disadvantage against this type. For each one, from 2 to 4 examples will be shown and given a brief description. An adult may also wonder: “*But what about the characters in the television show?*” This exhibit also gives a brief description of who those main characters are, why they are going through their own personal adventures, and the people who give them a heap of trouble. The different items included in this display include: stamps (including a Japanese booklet with both stamps and postal cards), souvenir sheets, Pokemon cards, a pencil, and a flip coin used in the card game. The exhibit explains the original Pokemon cartoon shown on TV; the movies, and the Pokemon Go mobile game, as well as identifying many different categories and species of Pokemon that have appeared on stamps. Text in italics refers to the attack move used by a specific Pokemon. Highlights: two philatelic items contain design errors (picture and spelling).
