### SPECIAL POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS

Six new items of United Nations postal stationery being issued April 26, 1963 are being released simultaneously on the first day of the Golden Anniversary Exhibition of the Rochester Philatelic Association. Through special arrangements, a United Nations Post Office has been set up in the Auditorium where U.N. stamps and stationery are available at face value.

The six new postal stationery issues are:

- 5c envelope (in 2 sizes) designed by El Mekki of Tunisia
- 8c air mail envelope (in 2 sizes) designed by George Hamori of Australia
- 4c postal card designed by Ole Hamann of Denmark
- 6c air mail postal card designed by Claude Bottiau of France

An exhibition post office also has been established by the United States Post Office Department in the Auditorium. Current commemorative stamps are available at this post office and a special canceling device is in use for covers mailed at this station.

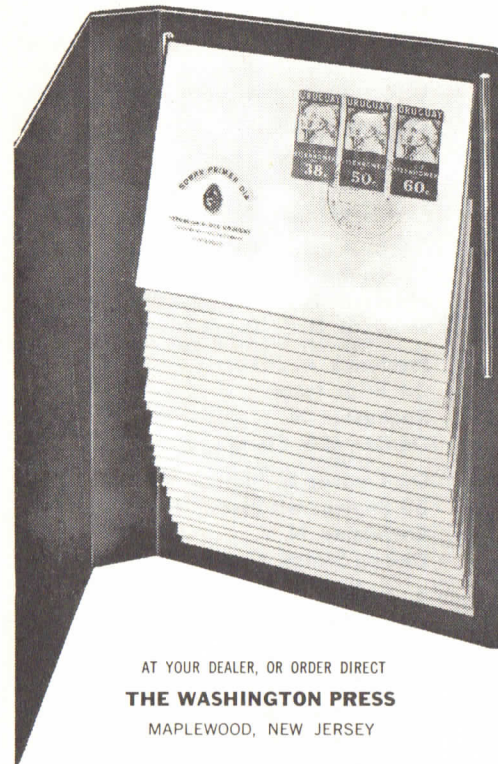

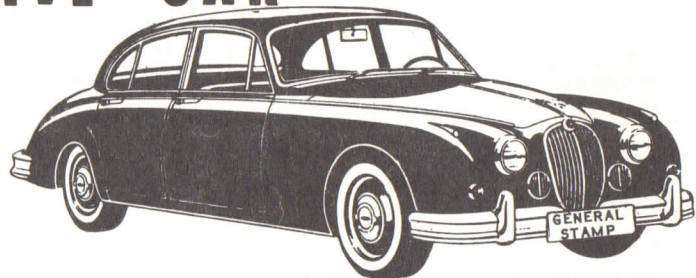

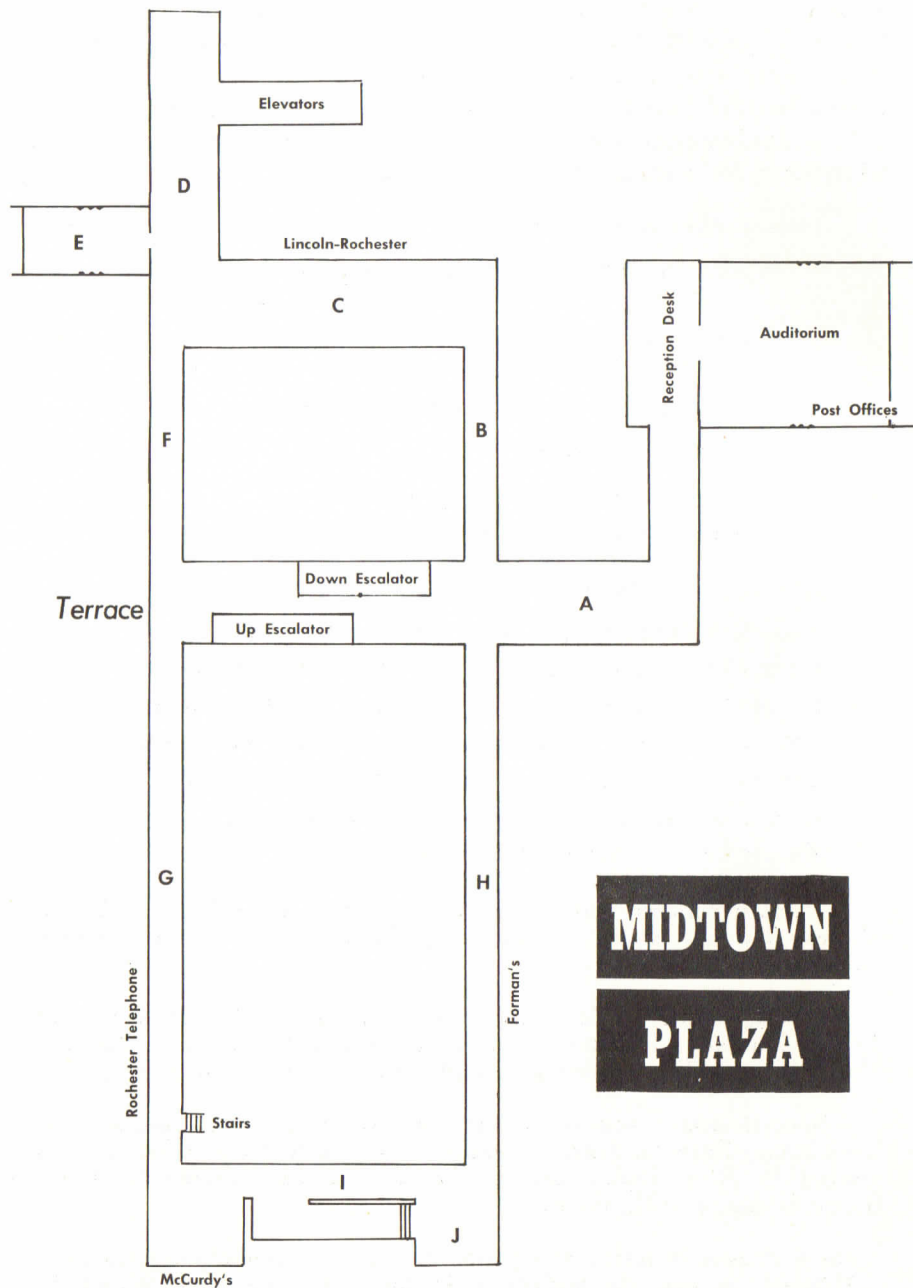
