Puns are the type of humor that can be enjoyed by all ages.


They make us cringe, but they do bring laughter.

Puns are typically spontaneous "at the moment" type of humor.


They do require a good comprehension of the English language to deliver the pun successfully.







This set of 5 stamps features images taken by the 320 mile high Hubble telescope of interestingly named nebulae and galaxies.






As you can see I decided to interject a little humor in these covers. Austin Powers and Dr. Evil must be out there somewhere!











These two stamp issues are not necessarily related, except for an X-Files TV series episode I somehow subconsciously remembered...





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


Using the special USPS Stamp Decoder on the stamp reveals the state's animal, a badger, among the clouds!








Here's the same set of 10 stamps using the standard black first day cancels with different cachets.





















I already discussed eggplant, but is a tomato a fruit or vegetable? Answer: It's a fruit eaten as a vegetable.








My questionable humor at work again. Just watch where you stick your tongue!










I "did it my way" and couldn't wait to add this image to the ceremony's program and it had nothing to do with Florida.






I had a lot of fun making this cachet for the 2021 Brush Rabbit additional ounce stamp, worth 20 cents at the time. Hare-Larious, no?







I could not resist creating cachets for the 2021 Heritage Breed set of 10 animal stamps.













Animals and kids (as well as the *goat* kind) have lots of pun-potential.














You should have realized I like to add plenty of references about beer in my puns. Homer Simpson, "drink" your heart out!











Later in 2021 the 4 stamp "Otters in the Snow" issue was released for Christmas. I put together 2 combo-covers and 4 singles.















It was fun to work with these stamps.












Christmas and Santa Clause— So many possibilities for this 4 stamp set...






Note Santa stuck in the chimney and the reindeer laughing and shouting Ho Ho Ho.













Who doesn't like a monster movie? This 1997 set of 5 was released for Stamp Collecting Month—now a dead USPS 'celebration.'



That's a wrap – like a director says when a movie is finished. Did you get that one?






