This year ROPEX celebrates the centennial of the modern Olympic games. One hundred years is a milestone for any event, especially one which unites the peoples of the world through the high ideals of sportsmanship and brotherhood.

It's an honor for any athlete to win an Olympic gold medal, especially if the games are held in his or her country. Such was the case at the first modern games in Athens, 1896. Spiriden Louis, a peasant, won his nation's only medal that year in the marathon.

Few people are unfamiliar with the names of Jesse Owens, Muhammad Ali, Mark Spitz, Peggy Fleming and Mary Lou Retton- all Olympic champions. Team competitions have brought us the 1980 US hockey team's "miracle on ice" and more recently, the first of many basketball "dream teams." These and many more Olympians can fortunately be found on stamps, although not necessarily those from the US!

In times of divisiveness, the power of the Olympic spirit allows us to dream of the universality of man. Little has changed since those first ancient games 2,770 years ago.






